### **Program-Specific Admission Requirements**

#### 1. Ministry Service Experience and/or Prior Theological Education

 Prospective students must have at least two years of ministry service experience or have completed prior theological and/or educational coursework. This coursework should include subjects such as homiletics, hermeneutics, and either systematic theology or studies in the New and Old Testament, or a combination thereof. Prospective students with a bachelor's degree from a nationally or regionally accredited university in a field other than theology, ministry, or related programs are exempt from this requirement.

### 2. Admissions Virtual Interview

Applicants must schedule and complete an admissions virtual interview with the college.

#### 3. Provisional Admission

• All students will receive provisional admission upon acceptance into the program until they complete one of the following courses with a grade of C or higher: AS 100: Success Strategies

for Online Learning (3 credits) or GE 100T: Success Strategies for Online Theological Learning (3 credits). Transfer students from an AETH certified institution or a nationally or regionally accredited university program may request a waiver for AS 100 or GE 100T.

## **Graduation Requirements**

- Achieve a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.3 or higher
- Successfully complete the HGCC Bible & Theology Standardized Exam (TS), consisting of a 45-minute assessment comprising 30 multiple-choice questions
- Successfully complete the HGCC Ministry Ethics Standardized Exam (MES), comprising a 45-minute assessment with 30 multiple-choice questions
- Submit a request for approval of certificate conferral to the registrar's office
